Postor's Monthly Message Navigating Forgiveness

s Christians, we understand that grace and forgiveness are at the core of our theology. We look to Jesus, who cried "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do," even as he was dying on the cross. We hear we are to forgive seventy times seven in Matthew 18.

In last month's newsletter, Pastor Chad even highlighted how it's a good thing most of us do not have our worst moments held against us.

However, I think it's important to also acknowledge that sometimes our worst moments can cause immense harm to others, and while as Christians we are called to forgive those who harm us, we cannot forget that forgiveness is a process. Even Jesus outlined a process regarding forgiveness for the body of believers that involved accountability and repentance. His steps involved going to the individual (if it's safe), then taking it to a smaller group to address, and then finally the wider community if the first two failed. Forgiveness came after the person repented.

Now, we know that you will not always get repentance from someone who has wronged you, and forgiveness at that point becomes more about you just being able to release the anger and hurt that holds you captive. This becomes more about your own liberation from the harm they have done.

As someone who has worked a lot with abuse and trauma victims, I want us to make sure we are careful and mindful of this process so that we never shame a victim into trying to forgive before some of these steps have been completed.

Desmond Tutu, in his "Book of Forgiving," outlines a few of these steps. The first two involve telling the truth and telling your story. Silencing victims and then expecting or shaming them into forgiving without the ability to publicly tell their story or tell the truth about what happened is its own form of spiritual abuse and re-victimizes and traumatizes the person who was harmed/wronged. We many times see this happening in the church, trying to cover up and hide embarrassing situations and then shaming the victim into forgiving without any of this accountability.

While the ultimate goal of forgiveness is of course to have reconciliation, just like the reconciliation we have with Christ, that is not always safe or possible in the midst of our human messiness and we must recognize that reality. Sometimes forgiveness when there is a lack of repentance on the part of the wrong-doer and/or a continued pattern of behavior that goes unchanged, involves releasing the relationship as the necessary outcome. Asking an abuse victim to forgive an abuser when they're going to just turn around and do the abuse all over again is its own form of abusive behavior.

Also, given forgiveness is a process, it takes people time and there is no timetable on how long it takes someone to get there. Telling people to "get over it" or "move on,"

especially when these steps have not been followed or completed, is dismissive and harmful.

Jesus didn't hide the scars of his abuse. He bore them at his resurrection for all to see. Forgiveness did not wipe away the reality of what happened. In fact, Jesus forces us to confront and wrestle with the scars of his abuse. He won't let us ignore what happened to him. We can't pretend the crucifixion wasn't a thing.

What Jesus' forgiveness did, however, was create a path forward. It created a future. The relationship between the victim and the offender will most likely forever be changed, so forgiveness does not mean things go back to the way they were. There may be a new way forward, but it will be different from before.

Luckily for us, along with that forgiveness from Jesus comes a new life and a new creation, where hopefully not only the things we've done to others are forgotten, but that the traumas and wrongs that have been done *to us* will be wiped away as well, forging that new future and new relationship.
