Fighting Fire with Fire

Another year, another Holy Week in the books. Our next major church holiday is Pentecost on May 28th.

And by major, I mean that the church thinks this day is rather important, but it doesn't have a lot of commercial value so it doesn't really get the attention culturally like Christmas and Easter. No one's going around exchanging matches or doing Pentecost flame hunts. Churches aren't packed because it's not one of the few times a year everyone feels obligated to show up. Still, Pentecost was, for the ancient Israelites, one of the three "required" festivals (Passover and the Feast of Booths were the other two) that they were supposed to make the trek to Jerusalem for. It was the "first fruits" harvest festival in which they also celebrated the giving of the Torah fifty days after their release from Egypt. In essence, it became a celebration of the birthday of God's covenant with the Israelites.

Pentecost in Christianity is viewed similarly, only rather than Moses on

Mount Sinai, we celebrate the arrival of the Holy Spirit, which we are told is also God's instruction that is being imparted to us. Like Torah, the Holy Spirit is a guiding presence in our lives. Its arrival heralds a new way in which God's instruction gets lived out. No longer a set of external rules and regulations, but an indwelling of God's presence within God's people.

It's kind of a big deal.

The scene that depicts the Holy Spirit's arrival is rather dramatic, with tongues of fire coming to rest upon each of the disciples before they go out and begin speaking in the languages of the world that were gathered in Jerusalem for the Holy Day celebrations.

This past weekend I helped lead a retreat up at Luther Springs. The theme of the retreat was titled, "Journey to Joy." The idea was to move us from our lament and despair at the beginning of the retreat, to joy by the end. One of the workshops I led was about taking all the images and words we'd come up with in a different workshop that represented our current or past lament and despair and *(continued on page 3...)*

change those images/words into something positive, like a work of art. To transform something ugly into something beautiful.

I described the parts of my life, and the things in the world that were cause for lament and despair as "being on fire." The world as a whole just sometimes feels like it's on fire, doesn't it? That everything is just a hot mess? What does God do with hot messes?

He takes our Good Fridays, and turns them into Easters. He turns our mourning into dancing; our sorrows into joy; hot messes into fiery passion and action.

On the day of Pentecost, the disciples were still hiding out in fear. Jesus had been raised, but now he was gone having ascended into heaven. What were they to do now? They were choosing to just sit around and mope. I mean, how could twelve people change anything in the world, right?

God chose to fight the fires of despondency with the fires of Pentecost. Fire has a long symbolic history of being a refining tool of God that burns away the chaff, burns away the ugly stuff, in order to mold and shape us into something new.

The disciples were transformed by the fires of Pentecost to move out of their hiding place and out into the world where they proclaimed the Good News of the resurrection. He transformed the fires of despair into fires of hope and new life.

This Pentecost, how will God transform your sorrows into joy? How will you fight the fires of despair in our world with the fires of God's Spirit? What Good News will you share in the world?
