Pastor's Monthly Message Slow, But Steady

Everyone who knows me, knows I'm not a patient person. And I learned a long time ago not to pray for more patience, because God just gives me more things to be patient about.

Admittedly some days it feels like I take two steps forward and three steps back when it comes to making some of the updates we want over at the Stuart site. I was all excited that we finally we were getting estimates in for the painting of the facility—only to find out after waiting for two weeks that one of the painters didn't want the job. So, it was back to the drawing board finding more people to come in and give estimates.

We did determine that we are going to, if possible, sell the organ at the Stuart site, as we are living into the reality that even finding an organist at the Palm City site is proving to be nearly impossible. Getting rid of the organ opens up space possibilities for us both up front as well as in the back where the speakers are, and lets us now move forward with setting up the technology upgrades we've been waiting to do.

Thanks to Pete Morello's donation, we were able to get a temporary sign in place back in May and are working on applying for the funding for a more permanent sign.

At Synod Assembly we were informed about a Vision to Action grant that we can apply for by August for up to \$25,000. We just have to come up with a ministry "project" we want that money to go toward.

Given our focus at the Stuart site will be on the 50-70 year-old range, we are putting our heads together to consider what sort of ministry projects might target this demographic in our area. (If you have thoughts and suggestions, please feel free to bring them to me.)

I do want to give a shout-out to Belinda Lowe and Kim Shrum, both members of our congregational council, and Karen Gumm, our Stuart secretary, for all their backbreaking work and labor over at the Stuart site helping to get a lot of the stuff that was cluttering the front of the sanctuary and the Fellowship Hall back rooms cleaned out. That was a big task! Our hope is that we can get those two back rooms in good enough shape that we can put Family Promise families in them so we don't lose our entire Fellowship Hall for the week. (Seems to never fail that whenever Family Promise families are in the Fellowship Hall,

it's raining outside when we try to do fellowship hour out there.)

We have had some flooring donated to us from Coastal Flooring, we just have to pick it out. Jodi Dudeney, one of our Stuart council representatives,
