God as Our Security Base

Years ago, I did the "CliftonStrengths" assessment where you learn what you naturally do best. One of my "strengths" is Learning. So this Lent I signed up for two courses, The Spirituality of Fundraising hosted online by the Henri Nouwen Society and Immanuel's Hebrews Bible study hosted by Deacon Cheryl.

Henri Nouwen was a Dutch Catholic priest, professor, writer and theologian. His interests were rooted primarily in psychology, pastoral ministry, spirituality, social justice and community. Each of his books explores one aspect or another of the inner life and the way of the heart. His Spirituality of Fundraising is a stewardship "classic" that challenges church leaders (and members) to see fundraising as, first and foremost, a matter of the heart. From the perspective of the gospel, it is about our connection with self, God, neighbor, and the world around us. Fundraising is a concrete way to help the kingdom of God emerge.

What is the kingdom? Henri explains, "The kingdom is where God provides for all that we need. It is the realm of sufficiency where we are no longer pulled here and there by anxiety of having enough." So countercultural, where worth is often defined by money and class, and self-reliance is valued above all else.

In the book of Hebrews, the writer alternates between severe warning and strong encouragement to a discouraged Christian community. He encourages the community not to disregard God's word: "Therefore, we must pay greater attention to what we have heard so that we do not drift away from it" (Heb 2:1).

So what have we heard? Jesus talked a lot about both the kingdom of God and money. He compares the kingdom to a mustard seed "which, when sown upon the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet when it is sown, it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs, and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade. (Mk 4:31-32). Immanuel has been sowing "seeds" and exploring options through Lenten speakers on how to expand our ministry outward, making a difference in the lives of our neighbors. Kingdom of God work.

Paul's letter to the Ephesians talks about how small acts of generosity can grow into something far beyond what we could ever ask or imagine. This letter offers a wonderful prayer to God for our whole community as we go forward:

"Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, to him be the glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever (Eph 3:20)."
